Heard learned counsel for the parties.

The present habeas corpus petition has been filed by the
petitioner, who is father of the corpus Mst. 'G', a minor girl. It has
been stated that Mst. 'G' is in the illegal detention of respondent
No.4.

In pursuance of the directions issued by the Court, on
02.02.2026, the corpus Mst. 'G' was produced before us. We had
conferred with the corpus and she had stated that since her father



is involved in some illegal activities, therefore, she does not want to go at her parental home.

This Court found that her mental state was not stable, therefore, she was sent to the Children's Home, Chanderia, so that after counselling, if she get some proper thought process, she will be able to take a decision.

Today also, the corpus has been produced before us. We have conferred with the corpus. However, she has maintained the same stand that she does not want to go at her parental home and she wants to live at the Children's Home only. She has stated that she was not in any illegal detention of respondent No.4 and she left her home on her own free will without any pressure. She has desired that until she attains the age of majority, she wants to live at Children's Home.

Learned Additional Advocate General has produced before us a report of the counsellors, who had counselled the corpus Mst. 'G' in the Children's Home, Chanderia.

In the considered opinion of this Court, the corpus Mst. 'G' is very firm that she does not want to go at her parental home as she may suffer torture at the hands of her parents.

In view of the statements made before us and after perusing the report of the counsellors, we deem it appropriate that Mst. 'G' shall remain in the Children's Home at Udaipur until she attains the age of majority. Upon attaining the age of majority, she will be free to live at the place of her choice.

It is further directed that Secretary, District Legal Services Authority, Udaipur shall visit children's home and monitor the up-





keeping of the corpus Mst. 'G' on a regular basis at least once in two months.

A copy of this order be sent to the Secretary, District Legal Services Authority, Udaipur.

The habeas corpus petition is, therefore, disposed of.
